

Artists Walk exhibiting Opportunity at Alexandra Palace

Deadline 4th November 2020

The arts team at Alexandra Palace have kindly given us access to some of the windows on the palace building. With a high footfall and on such a beautiful victorian building these are excellent exhibition spaces.

Timings are tight so we're asking for you to respond to two briefs. This is currently only open to artists already participating in Artists Walk.

Ourselves, the Arts Team at Alexandra Palace and a steering group from the Young People's Program will be selecting the work.



Priority will be given to works about inclusivity, representation of London, activism. We suggest entering more than one piece.

Each proposal must be submitted as an A4 pdf. With the image, your name, one sentence about the work and your website and whether it is an entry for Brief 1:Poster Show, Brief 2:A5 Postcard Show or both. We cannot accept entries that do not meet these requirements and we will not have time to feedback before selection.

The work will only be viewed on screen, so please keep the file size down to 2 megabytes.

1. Poster Show

We are looking for work to place in a huge set of 12 windows (between the arches above). They can hold work 70cm x 50cm.

You must be able to provide your work printed as an A2 poster. (We can suggest Panopus in Islington for this). We cannot cover the cost of this.

You do not need to provide your work unless selected.

We do not know how the work will fair over time in these windows, so we cannot take any responsibility for damage to work. **Deadline 4th November 2020**

2. A5 Postcard Show

We have a set of windows on the old BBC Broadcast Tower and the windows of the CUfOS building.

You must be able to deliver your work printed to A5 size on good quality paper for this show. We would like to include as many participating artists as possible. Please enter more than one piece for selection.

You do not need to provide your work unless selected.

We do not know how the work will fair over time in these windows, so we cannot take any responsibility for damage to work. **Deadline 4th November 2020**
